# Appendix-Kha <br> The Fifteenth Statutes of the University Statutes regarding the Institute of Renewable Energy 

1. (a) The University of Dhaka shall establish an Institute of Renewable Energy (IRE) at Dhaka as a constituent Institution with a separate Board of Governors.
(b) The IRE will be established on the [date] by converting the erstwhile Renewable Energy Research Centre of the University of Dhaka with all its assets, funds, rights, interests, properties etc. and all its employees into a constituent Institution of the University on the basis of a resolution of the Senate of the University.
(c) The service of the teachers, officers and other employees of the erstwhile Renewable Energy Research Centre, with the same terms and conditions appiled during their iast appointment and for the full-time employees the duration of service towards 'qualifying service' within the meanings of Statute 11 of the Tenth Statues of the University.
Aims and objects.
2. The aims and objects of the Institute shall be -
(a) to initiate, organize and perform research in the fields of Renewable Energy;
(b) to provide courses leading to Bachelor of Science (B.SC), Master of Science (M.Sc), Master of Philosophy (M.Phil), Doctor of Phllosophy (Ph.D) and Diploma degrees related to Renewable Energy;
(c) to provide facilities for development of qualified manpower in Renewable Energy Technology;
(d) to promote the use of RET in the University and the country;
(e) to promote multidisciplinary development of RET products;
(f) to provide training to students, teachers, researchers, officers and employees of the University and other educational institutions in relevant fields;
(g) to provide short term courses and training to interested and qualified persons from outside the University in relevant fields of RET;
( $h$ ) to provide consulting and advisory services to the University and other educational institutions, the Government of Bangladesh, NGOs, private and public sector corporations, industries and all other organizations which seek such assistance;
(I) to hold seminars, conferences, workshops, exhibitions and other events related to the development and disseminations of RET in the country;
(k) to maintain and improve the existing energy park as an outdoor lab for demonstration and increase of public awareness;
(I) to plan, install, mai, dain design and development of RET devices;
(m) to improve energy efficiency, energy conservation and energy policy;
(n) to act as a standard testing lab for renewable energy devices for national, regional and international certification;
(o) to establish link-programs with various institutions/ organizations within the country and abroad.
Constitution of Board of Governors

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3. (a) The management of the Institute shall be vested in a Board of Governors consisting of:
I. The Vice-Chancellor of the University of DhakaChairman;
ii. The Pro-vice Chancellor of the University;
iii. The Treasurer of the University?
iv. Two persons to be nominated by the Chancellor;
$v$. One nominee of the Syndicate from among its members;
vi. One nominee of the Academic Council among its members;
vil. Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Technology;
viii. Dean of the Faculy of Science;
ix. The Secretary of the Ministry of Energy, Power and Mineral Resources or his nominee from the Ministry not below the rank of Joint Secretary;
$x$. The Chairperson of the Bangladesh Council for Scientific and Industrial Research or his nominee.
xi. The Director of the Centre for Advanced Research in Sciences
xil. The Chairperson of the Dept. of Applied Physics, Electronics and Communication Engineering;
xiil. One teacher from among the teachers of the IRE other than the Director, nominated by the Academic Committee of the IRE;
xiv. The Director of the IRE, who will serve as the Member-Secretary of the Board.
(b) The term of the office of appointed and nominated members shall be two years but they shall continue in office till their successors enter upon the office.
(c) Four members including the Chairman shall form the quorum for the meetings of the Board of Governors.

Powers of the Board of Governors

Courses \& Syllabi
4. The Board of Governors shall have the following powers:
(a) To consider the academic courses and programs and the Budget Estimate of the Institute submitted by the Director of the Institute and $t$ approve, reject or fer them back for such modifications as the Board of Governors may suggest;
(b) To appoint teachers, officers and staffs of the Institute, subject to the provisions of Sections 8 and 11, with rank and scale of pay not below that of other teachers and officers of the University:
(c) To frame such rules and regulations as may be considered necessary for the proper organization and administration of the institute and the proper conduct of its examinations, subject to the approval of the Syndicate;
provided that the rules and regulations relating to examinations and other academic matters shall go to the Syndicate through the Academic Council;
(d) To create administrative, academic, technical, ministerial or any other posts on a permanent basis and to abolish or suspend any of them as and when hecessary, subject to the approval of the Syndicate;
(e) To receive and accept all bequests, donations and other funds from individuals or organizations and to use such funds for the benefit of the Institute; such activities shall be reported to the Syndicate or the Academic Council from time to time;
(f) To exercise such other powers as may be delegated to it by the Syndicate or the ademic Council from time to time.
5. The courses and syllabi as well as the examinations and degree requirements of the Institute shall be prescribed by the Academic Councll of the University which shall take into consideration such recommendations and proposals as may be submitted by the Institute or by the Committee of Courses and Studies in Renewable Energy:
6. (a) There shall be a Committee of Courses and Studies in Renewable Energy consisting of
I. The Dlrector of the Institute - Chairman
iI. All Professors and Associate Professors of the Institute;
iil. Two teachers of the Institute;
Iv. The Chairman, Department of Applied Physics, Electronics \& Communication Engineering of the Universlty of Dhaka;
v. Joint Secretary, the Ministry of Energy, Power and Mineral Resources or his representative not below the rank of Deputy Secretary.
(b) One-third of the tetal number of members, fraction being counted as one, shal form the ahioram for the meetings of
7. The functions of the Committee of Courses and Studies shall be to prepare courses and syllabi and to advise the Academic Council and Board of Governors on all matters connected with the objects of the Institute

Selection
Board for Appointment of Teaching Posts
8. (1) Appointment to teaching posts shall be made on the recommendation of a Selection Board constituted for the purpose as follows:
(a) For Professorships and Associate Professorships:
I. The Vice-Chancellor - Chairman
ii. One nominee of the Board of Governors;
iii. One nominee of the Syndicate;
Iv. Two members nominated by the chancellor;
v. Three experts of whom at least one must be an external expert, nominated by the Chancellor.
(b) For teaching posts other than Professorships and Associate Professorships:

1. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor - Chairman;
ii. One nominee of the Syndicate;
III. One nominee of the Board of Governors;
iv. The Director of the Institute;
v. One expert to be nominated by the Syndicate.
(2) Four members including the Chairman shall form the quorum for meetings of the Selection Board for Professors and Associate Professors and three members including the Chairman shall form the quorum for meeting of the Selection Board for other teaching posts.
(3) The term of the office of the nominated members shall be two years but they shall continue in office till their successors enter upon the office.
(4) The Selection Board shall report to the Board of Governors, which shall, if it accepts the recommendations of the Selection Board, make the appointment to the post accordingly.
(5) If the Board of Governors does not accept the recommendation of the Selection Board it shall request the Syndicate to refer the case to the Chancelior, who will make such appointments as he thinks fit.
(6) The Board of Governors may, on the recommendation of the selection Board and with the approval of the Syndicate, offer an eminently qualified person a Professorship in the Institute on such terms and conditions as it may determine.

Provided that temporary appointments for a period not exceeding six months to post of teachers other than Professors and Associate Professors may be made by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Director of

Academic and C\&D Committees recognitions of achievernens and shall not be granted automatically on the basis of seniority only.
10. (a) Director of the Inst te shall be appointed by the ViceChancellor for a term of thice years, from among the teachers of the Institute not below the rank of Assoclate Professor, by rotation in order of seniority. If there is no teacher of the Institute with such a rank, the Vice-Chancellor may appoint as Director a teacher of the University from such a rank outside the Institute with terms and conditions to be determined by the Board of Governors.
(b) The Director shall remain in charge of the Institute and shall be responsible for the overall management and supervision of the Institute.
(c) The Director shall be entitled to such allowances and privileges as may be determined by the Board of Governors.
(d) In case of casual vacancy for less than 30 days due to the absence on leave of the Director, the Vice-Chancellor may place a teacher of the Institute in charge of the office of the Director for the period of absence on leave of the Director.
(e) The teacher so placed in charge shall perform only routine duties of the Director.
(f) If the casual vacancy is for 30 days or more, the ViceChancellor shall appoint a teacher as Acting Director for the period of absence on leave of the Director. The Acting Director shall have the powers of the Director.
12. (a) The Institute shall have the foliowing committees, namely:
i. Academic Committee, consisting of all the teachers of the Institute;
ii. Co-ordination and Development Committee consisting of
(b) The Academic Committee shail deal with:
i. Admission of students;
ii. Syllabuses and courses of studies;
iII. Examinations;
iv. Teaching in the Institute;
v. Co-curricular activities of the students in the Institute.
(c) The Co-ordination and Development Committee shall deal with:
I. Expansion of the Institute;
ii. Appointment of teachers.

## Explanations:

i. The Co-ordination and Development Committee shall be responsible for the improvement of the existing teaching and research facilities and for planning of further development of the Institute;
ii. It shall periodically review the academic and research programs of the Institute and forward its observations to the Academic Committee for consideration and onward transmission to the relevant authorities.
iii. It shall have the right to recommend upgrading, confirmation and increments of teachers of the Institute In recognition of specific professional achievements.
IV. The creation of new posts in the Institute shall be initiated by this Committee.
v. The Director of the Institute shall place before this Committee all the applications received for any post in the Institute. The Committee shall scrutinize the applications and forward a statement indicating which of the applications satisfy the requirements and which do not.
vi. The University may not grant leave of absence to a teacher during term time for a period of more than three months without the recommendation of the Committee.
vil. Proposal for any ad-hoc appointment in the Institute shall be sent by the Director with the recommendation of this Committee.
viil. A member of the Committee shall withdraw from the meeting when matters of his/her promotions, confirmation etc. are under discussion in the Committee.
